# **Paycheck Protection Program**

A number of tools were released to help businesses navigate the popular Paycheck Protection Program:

- A mapping tool to help businesses find an approved SBA lender can be found <u>here</u>. This tool is greatly improved and much more comprehensive than the original tool that was available last week. Potential borrowers should call banks before showing up, particularly if they are not current clients.

# SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (EIDL)

Jim Foley of Bradley's Small Business Development Center reports some positive changes to the EIDL program. The biggest change is that personal guarantees are no longer required for loans of \$200,000 or less. Further, loans under \$500,000 do not require any collateral. SBA are processing loans directly and according to them, those that applied last week should be seeing confirmation "within days." # **REMINDER: Downstate Business Stabilization Program Application Portal Open**

Small businesses in Greater Peoria who have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 crisis may be eligible to apply for a grant of up to \$25,000 through Illinois' Downstate Business Stabilization Program. The program is aimed at businesses with 50 or less employees that have been in operation, with the current ownership, since at least January 1, 2017. Due to the nature of the funding behind this program, businesses in the cities of Peoria and Pekin are ineligible. Businesses located in Peoria, Woodford and Mason counties have until 5 p.m. on Friday, April 10 to submit their completed applications. Tazewell county businesses have until 5 p.m. on Monday, April 13. More information, including a link to the application portal, can be found at <u>www.gpcovid.com</u>.
