#### Save Small Business Fund

The U.S. Chamber Foundation is launching their <u>Save Small Business Fund</u>. Funded by contributions from corporate and philanthropic partners, the U.S. Chamber Foundation will be providing \$5,000 supplemental grants to small employers (between 3-20 employees) in economically vulnerable communities. A zip-code lookup on their website will tell you if a business is considered to be located in a "vulnerable community." Applications for the Save Small Business Grant Fund will open this Monday, April 20, 2020, at 3:00 p.m. ET. Interested individuals can sign up for an email alert to be notified of the window opening. The effort is part of the U.S. Chamber's larger <u>Save Small Business Initiative</u>.

## **Paycheck Protection Program Depleted**

The SBA announced earlier today that its popular Paycheck Protection Program had been depleted and no more applications were being accepted (Forbes article <u>here</u>). Congress is currently debating a new relief package that is likely to include more funds for PPP. A quick survey of Peoria financial institutions yielded mixed advice for those interested in PPP. Some were still accepting applications in anticipation of another window opening while others are not accepting new applications at the moment. Those interested should contact their lender to discuss options.
