Stay-At-Home Order Extended, Revised

You can find the new Executive Order extending and revising the stay-at-home order <u>here</u>. The order mandates all citizens over the age of 2 to wear a face covering in public places when social distancing is not possible; imposes restrictions on "essential" retail stores; allows for curbside pickup and delivery at "non-essential" stores; and outlines a number of other restrictions.

New State Safety Regulations for Manufacturers

Within the Executive Order are new safety requirements for the manufacturing sector. These include:

- Providing face coverings to all employees who are not able to maintain a minimum six feet of social distancing at all times
- Staggering shifts
- Reducing line speeds
- Operating only essential lines while shutting down non-essential lines
- Ensuring that all spaces where employees may gather, including locker rooms and lunchrooms, allow for social distancing; and
- Downsizing operations to the extent necessary to allow for social distancing and to provide a safe workspace in response to the COVID-19 emergency

Poster Requirement

Section 1.5 of the Executive Order states: "All businesses that have employees physically reporting to a work-site must post the guidance from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and Office of the Illinois Attorney General regarding workplace safety during the COVID-19 emergency. The guidance will be posted on the IDPH webpage." The poster can be found here.

Employee Retention Credit – CARES Act (FAQs)

The IRS has posted updated Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) to IRS.gov providing answers regarding the Employee Retention Credit under the CARES Act. The Employee Retention Credit under the CARES Act encourages businesses to keep employees on their payroll. The refundable tax credit is 50% of up to \$10,000 in wages paid by an eligible employer whose business has been financially impacted by COVID-19. Learn more <u>here</u>.
