Illinois Entering "Bridge Phase" On Friday, May 14

The Illinois Department of Public Health will be easing restrictions on certain businesses and activities as the state moves into the "Bridge Phase" on May 14. The Bridge Phase is a half step between the current Phase 4 restrictions and Phase 5, where there are no restrictions at all. Below is a chart of areas impacted by the Bridge Phase. Businesses and activities not listed should follow Phase 4 guidelines. More information on all the restrictions of the Restore Illinois Plan can be found here.

Amusement parks	60% capacity
Festivals and general admission outdoor spectator events	30 people per 1,000 sq. ft.
Flea and farmers markets	Indoor: 15 people per 1,000 sq. ft. Outdoor: 30 people per 1,000 sq. ft.
Meetings, conferences and conventions	Lesser of 1,000 people or 60% capacity
Museums	60% capacity
Recreation	Indoor: Lesser of 100 people or 50% capacity Outdoor: Maximum groups of 100; multiple groups permissible
Social events	Indoor: 250 people Outdoor: 500 people
Spectator events (ticketed and seated)	60% capacity
Theaters and performing arts	60% capacity
Zoos	60% capacity

Paycheck Protection Program Funds Exhausted

As of May 6, 2021, funding for the Paycheck Protection Program has been exhausted. The SBA will continue funding outstanding approved PPP applications, but new qualifying applications will only be funded through Community Financial Institutions, financial lenders who serve underserved communities.

SBA Now Accepting Restaurant Revitalization Fund Applications

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) began accepting applications on Monday, May 3, at 11 a.m. for the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF). RRF is a \$28.6 billion federal program created by the American Rescue Plan that will assist eating and drinking establishments (i.e. bars, restaurants, food

truck operators, caterers) by replacing lost revenue in 2020. The online application will remain open to any eligible establishment until all funds are exhausted.

In preparation, the SBA recommends qualifying applicants familiarize themselves with the application process in advance to ensure a smooth and efficient application experience, specifically by:

- Reviewing the official guidance, including <u>program guide</u>, <u>RRF knowledge base</u>, and application sample.
- Preparing the required documentation.
- Working with a point-of-sale vendor or visiting <u>sba.gov</u> to submit an application when the application portal opens.

While all eligible businesses can now apply, for the first 21 days that the program is open SBA will prioritize reviewing applications from small businesses owned by women, veterans, and socially and economically disadvantaged individuals. Applications submitted by other types of businesses during this period will not be reviewed until later in May.
